Chronic: **Indoxacarb technical** has been extensively tested on laboratory mammals and in test tube systems. No evidence was obtained of mutagenic, carcinogenic or reproductive effects. Animal testing showed effects on embryo-fetal development at levels equal to or above those causing maternal toxicity. A repeated dose inhalation study in rats showed signs of incoordination, increased mortality or reduced survival and respiratory irritation. A repeated dose study in rats showed red blood cell destruction causing abnormal decrease in number of red blood cells (anaemia).
